## Introduction

The Technical Assistance (TA) team at the Clearinghouse for Military Family Readiness at Penn State (Clearinghouse) conducted a rapid review of publicly available resources on the topic of pre-school and pre-kindergarten (pre-K) options or activities for military children who live on or near Ellsworth Air Force Base (AFB). Please note that this list is not exhaustive, and the resources provided are not endorsed by the Clearinghouse.

This report contains the following elements:

- Background information on pre-school and pre-K in South Dakota,
- A list of pre-school/pre-K options and contact information for each school,
- Available early learning resources,
- Alternative options of things to do in the Ellsworth AFB area with children ages 0-5,

## Background

Early childhood education (ECE) is a crucial part of preparing children for kindergarten and supporting their school readiness and success. However, quality ECE programs may be costly, which can pose a barrier to accessing these services for some families. Yearly child care costs can range from \$150 per family to \$48,800 per family (Cannon et al., 2017). As a solution to costly ECE, many states provide state-funded pre-K programs. However, South Dakota is one of only six states that does not offer a state-funded pre-K program (Friedman-Krauss et al., 2021). In addition, South Dakota has the highest percentage of working parents in the nation—8% higher than the national average of 68%. This situation leaves these parents with a higher need to find suitable ECE options (The Annie E. Casey Foundation, 2024).

Other subsidized programs, such as Head Start, have income limits, and this criterion disqualifies many families from being eligible for these cost-affordable services. For instance, a family of four must make under \$30,000 per year to be eligible for South Dakota Head Start programs (South Dakota Head Start, 2024). In 2021, in South Dakota, the median household income was \$66,843, which far exceeds the federal poverty guidelines but may not allow enough income to cover the cost for a full-day ECE program (The Annie E. Casey Foundation, 2024).

In response to the educational needs of families with young children in South Dakota, this report offers a list of potential preschool/pre-K options and additional activities in the

local area for children ages 0-5. The South Dakota Department of Social Services and the Department of Health also offer recommendations and guidance for programs for families with young children.

#### **Chapel in the Hills**

Chapel in the Hills is an exact reproduction of the famous Borgund Stavkirke of Laerdal, Norway, which was a wooden church built without using nails but only tongue and groove construction. South Dakota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) conducts worship services at 7:30 p.m. in the chapel during the summer. Visitors are encouraged to wander the chapel grounds or take a walk on the Meditation Trail—a path that is complete with benches and statuary, which provides an additional place for reflection, prayer, and meditation. In addition, you can visit the stabbur, the authentic grass-roofed store house that houses a gift shop of Scandinavian merchandise, books, chapel souvenirs, and locally handmade Scandinavian craft items such as hardanger, rosemaling, and wood carvings. A museum is also on site, and it is a log cabin that features Scandinavian antiques. They are closed for the 2023 season and will re-open on May 1, 2024.

**D.C. Booth Historic National Fish Hatchery & Archives**

The D.C. Booth Historic National Fish Hatchery and Archives, formerly Spearfish National Fish Hatchery, is one of the oldest operating hatcheries in the country that is dedicated to fish culture and resource management. The Hatchery features the Von Bayer Museum of Fish Culture and contains the largest collection of fishery artifacts in the country; the Booth House, which features expansive porches, period furnishings, and Booth Family memorabilia; the Railcar that showcases a replica of Fish Car No. 3, which was used to move fish from hatcheries to lakes; the restored Yellowstone Boat that was responsible for carrying early hatchery workers to Yellowstone National Park to collect trout eggs; and a gift shop and 10 acres of ponds, rock walls, hiking trails, and scenic overlooks. Scavenger hunts and events are held throughout the year. In addition, guests are encouraged to feed the trout in the ponds.

### **Mount Rushmore National Memorial Park**

Mount Rushmore features the faces of Presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt, and Abraham Lincoln carved into the granite of the Black Hills. A Junior Ranger program is available to teach children about nature and have them interact with the park at their own pace. The programs available for children include the following:

- Junior Ranger Trainee
  - For children ages 3-4. No fee. Young visitors learn about Mount Rushmore and the natural resources through exploration activities found within a learning booklet. A Junior Ranger Badge is awarded upon completion of the booklet.
- Junior Ranger Activity Book
  - For children ages 5-12. No fee. Youngsters learn about Mount Rushmore as they explore the memorial through the activities inside a booklet. A Junior Ranger Badge and a certificate are awarded upon completion of the booklet. After the certificate is obtained, a souvenir patch may also be purchased in the Visitor Center or Information Center bookstore.
- Junior Ranger Quest

- This activity is part of the Mount Rushmore Self-Guided Tour, which is auditory and can be rented for \$8. The Junior Ranger Quest is a new adventure that allows you to participate in up to 16 challenges at different tour stops around the park. After you complete 12 of the challenges, you receive a Junior Ranger badge from a ranger desk, which is similar to the written Junior Ranger program.

The Junior Ranger Quest is also available for free download on the Apple Store and Google Play. Complete 12 of the activities anytime to download and print your own badge from the virtual Junior Ranger page.

Rocky Point Recreation Area is located on the Belle Fourche Reservoir. The 8,000-acre reservoir was created in 1911 when Orman Dam was constructed to store water for agricultural use. In 1989, Orman Dam was designated a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark.
