



Don't go it alone. School liaisons help with education questions, challenges and transitions.

School liaisons can provide support for your pre-K-12 education questions and concerns.

What is a school liaison?

School liaisons are located at each installation and are the main contact for military families, local school systems and installation leadership for school-related matters pre-K through 12th grade. School liaisons are experienced professionals who support, advise and build partnerships with the civilian and military community to help address common education challenges of military families.

Who is eligible for school liaison support?

School Liaison Program support is open to all War Department ID cardholders, educators who service military students and community partners involved with pre-K-12 education. Support is available to all uniformed services, including National Guard and reserves, those in geographically separated units, the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service and the uniformed members of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

What kinds of support do school liaisons offer?

School liaisons offer a wide variety of support to ensure the best possible education experience for military-connected students.

Services include:

- Transition support, including assistance with local school options, transfer of credits, youth sponsorship referrals and more
- Nontraditional schooling options, including home-schooling
- Special education support and referrals
- Deployment support
- College, career and military readiness
- Parent and educator workshops
- Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission, or MIC3, compliance
